Deutsche Bank extends support of Guernsey table tennis to ten years with renewed sponsorship deal

Deutsche Bank has announced that it has renewed its sponsorship of the Guernsey Table Tennis Association's (GTTA) Development Programme for a further two years, underlining its long-term support for the sport and grass roots development.

The partnership, which will now stretch to ten years, continues to flourish, with almost 100 juniors taking part in the Development Programme last season. Designed to take players from eight years old and train them to become accomplished players, the Programme also aims to create exciting opportunities to play table tennis for as many young players as possible within a safe and controlled environment.

Over the past season, young players taking part in the Programme have achieved success on both the national and international stage, with a number of graduates from the Programme now representing Guernsey at a senior level, and a team from Guernsey competing at the World Championships in Dortmund where they had their highest ever finishes in both the men's and women's competitions. Furthermore, in Guernsey's first season in the Junior British League, an excellent performance by the boys' junior team saw them gain a promotion from the Third to the Second Division.

The GTTA's Umpire Development Programme has also been successful this year, with two of Guernsey's umpires, Ben Foote and Tim Le Page, being selected to officiate at the Paralympics. Ben was also selected as Technical Official at the London Olympics 2012.

Bolstered by Deutsche Bank's renewed sponsorship, the new season will enable the GTTA to further evolve and expand the Development Programme through a combination of taster sessions, which attract 80 children each year, junior leagues and school competitions. With the demand to compete in tournaments growing every year, young players will be encouraged to take part in the Deutsche Bank Development Tournaments this season too.
